Curriculum Vitae: Rea Fulgosi-Masnjak, PhD, full professor, tenure, psychologist

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Rea Fulgosi-Masnjak, PhD is psychologist, full professor, tenure at the University of Zagreb, Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation Sciences. She is head of the postgraduate doctoral study: "Prevention Science and Disability Study".

She was born September 22nd 1960. in Zagreb, Croatia, where she lives till now. She is married and is mother of three children.

She graduated psychology, in 1983, obtained Master of science degree in psychology in 1989 and Doctoral degree in psychology in 1994, at the University of Zagreb, Faculty of Phylosophy, Department of Psychology.

The focus of her professional interest and research work is psychodiagnostics and the assessment of bio-psycho-social characteristics of children with developmental difficulties, adolescents and adults with disabilities (ID, mental health problems, ...), different forms of support - sensory integration therapy, social inclusion, inclusion into regular preschool and primary school education.

Presently, she is the co-leader (for Croatia) of the competitive Pan-European interdisciplinary scientific project, led by the Trinity College Dublin: "Digi-ID PLUS, Education in digital skills to support better health and social inclusion of adults with intellectual disabilities ", financed by EIT Health a network of health innovators backed by the European Union.

She teaches at the undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate level at the Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation Sciences at the University of Zagreb, University of Mostar, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Indiana State University, USA, courses: Assessment in education and rehabilitation I and II, Sensory Integration, Leisure, Recreation and Disability, Inclusive Research I and II, Education and Empowerment.

In addition to scientific and teaching work and near 40 years of experience, she is active in the professional field of psychological diagnostics, sensory integration therapy with children and parents' counseling within the Clinical and Teaching Center at the Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation Sciences, University of Zagreb. She founded a Cabinet for Sensory Integration, aimed to the assessment of sensory integration difficulties and to developing incentive programs based on the enriched sensory experiences with the goal of adopting successful ways to respond to environmental challenges, in order to, achieve better social inclusion, greater self-esteem and self-regulation in fulfilling the tasks of everyday life. Parents and professionals from other professions are also advised how to encourage appropriate sensory input within particular environments.

She is the author of the Lifelong Learning Program in the field of Sensory Integration, where she runs a series of education modules for Ayres model of intervention, theory of neural plasticity and neuroscience, motor control and motor learning. Within this program, the supervision of experts in kindergartens and primary schools is also being carried out.

As part of "pro bono" community activities, she has been continuously engaged giving professional lectures in kindergartens, primary schools and NGOs, popularizing a sensory integrative approach to space planning, learning and encouraging sensory modulated development of all children.

She is a co-author of the interdisciplinary technological project "The First Croatian Multisensory Garden", based on which the city of Zagreb was included in the catalog of ecological cities of Europe. She is Faculty's coordinator of the project components: "Park Volunteers" and "Analysis of Needs in Parks of the City of Zagreb" carried out within the project of the Educational Institute of Public Health Dr. Andrija Štampar- "Living Healthy", primarily focused on the multisensory perspective of park space design.

As a mentor to students, she received the Rector's Prize at ac. 2016/2017 year in the category of awards for socially useful work in the academic and wider community (Analysis of Needs in the Parks of Zagreb - Multidisciplinary Cooperation of Students and Mentors of the University of Zagreb).

Much of her professional work is aimed to education of the community in inclusive approach. Thus she held numerous invited and public lectures for preschool teachers, educators, professional associates, parents and the wider community through professional conferences, educations organized by Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation Sciences, institutions in the field of education and social censorship and civil society associations.

She has published a number of scientific and professional papers, she is co-author of university textbooks, she has been a leader and associate in scientific and professional projects and participated at the numerous scientific and professional international and domestic conferences also as a member of program and organizational committees of scientific and professional conferences. She is a member of the Editorial Bord of the open access Journal of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences.

She is one of the founders of the Croatian Society for Mental Health of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities and developmental Disorders, member of the Presidency of the Academy of Educational Sciences of Croatia and a member of the Croatian Psychological Society.

Regarding the field of mental health of persons with intellectual disabilities professor Fulgosi-Masnjak collaborated from 1999 to 2002. in the International MATRA project (leader prof. dr. sc. Anton Došen) "Supporting the development of intellectually disabled services addressing clients, professionals, parents and policies in the Croatian society".

She was president of the organizational committee of the 6th European Mental Health Congress in Intellectual Disabilities "Mental Health, Human Rights and Community", held October 10 - 13, 2007 in Zagreb.
