I have edited books about issues related to problem behaviours e.g. self-injurious behaviour the comprehensive multimodal diagnostic and intervention model of W.I. Gardner (USA), a translation of McGee Gentle teaching, the Dutch translation of the Mini PAS-ADD by Steve Moss (UK). I received a grant from the Stichting M.M. Delacroix concerning 'Practice and theories about ID and problem behaviour' for 11 years.
